

Director's Note

Story is powerful. Story provides windows, doors, and mirrors, connecting us to others' experiences and reflecting our own to show we are not alone. Through story, we can learn a little more about each other. Allow me to share a story of my own, a story about my mentor and professional inspiration, Mr. Alphonse F. Trezza.

Mr. Trezza was a proud child of Italian-American immigrants, a decorated WW2 Air Force veteran who married his sweetheart upon his return from the war. He put himself through college and graduate school, working at Drexel University, the Free Library of Philadelphia, and Villanova University. He moved

his family to Chicago to become the Director of the Catholic Library Association, then Associate Director of the American Library Association. His next move was to Springfield, Illinois, to become Director of the Illinois State Library, where he helped to found the multi-type regional library systems that are the backbone of resource-sharing among Illinois libraries today. From there, he went to Washington, D.C. to direct the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science, the federal agency that administered funding to libraries and was the precursor to the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

He ended his career as a professor of Library and Information Science at Florida State University, where he was my faculty advisor and mentor. However, he was my professional and personal inspiration long before that because he was my grandfather.


