## Director's Note

When I first started at the Downers Grove Public Library nearly 8 years ago, I was astounded at the number of book clubs that used the library to get their books! Book clubs and book discussions are a wonderful way for readers to connect with

others. With over 80 clubs regularly using the library to get their books, we worked with the Downers Grove Public Library Foundation to start a Book Club Bags collection that currently offers over 100 ready-to-go bags with 10 copies of the selected book, discussion questions, and author information. We also offer librarian-assisted holds to help gather copies of the book selected by the club if it's a title not available in a Book Club Bag.

Beyond all of the independent book clubs, the library offers book discussions that appeal to a variety of readers. Nonfiction readers can join us for coffee and donuts in the library for Real Reads. Pages & Pints provides fiction readers over the age of 21 a chance to talk about books over a pint at Goldfinger Brewing Company. Sci-fi/fantasy fans can explore magic and new worlds with their fellow readers at Stellar Reads. And for our 18+ folks with intellectual and developmental disabilities, the Next Chapter Book Club offers an inclusive experience where participants can enjoy books, make friends, and have fun.

Whether through independent book clubs or library book discussions, I hope we can all connect with someone over a great read this summer!



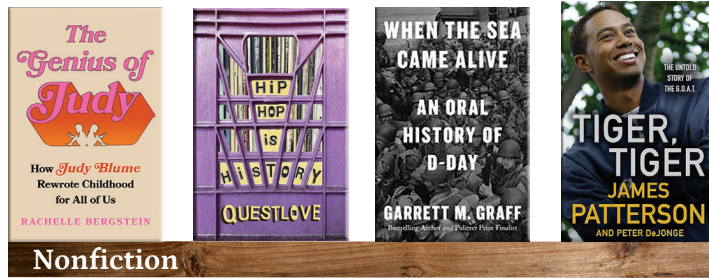

## New and Notable: Student Library Card Program

In March, the DGPL Board of Trustees and School District 58's Board of Education signed an intergovernmental agreement to provide library cards to every child enrolled in District 58 through the new Student Library Card Program. During District 58's registration process, parents could choose to opt-in for their students to receive a library card. Students will receive their library cards for the 2024-2025 school year. Student Library Cards may be used the same way as a regular library card, providing access to books, research databases, and study room spaces. Teachers will also be able to use DGPL's many online resources including databases and eMaterials to enhance and supplement their lessons. No other data, other than registration information, will be shared between the two entities, and cards will not be created for students without guardian consent. This initiative is made possible through the Cards for Kids Act expansion which allowed the DGPL Board of Trustees to waive registration fees for children under 18 who live outside of a library district, for example, in unincorporated Downers Grove. DGPL will coordinate card registration with area libraries on behalf of District 58 students who live in other municipalities.

The library is excited about this partnership, which provides thousands of children access to its resources without any burden or cost to students or District 58!

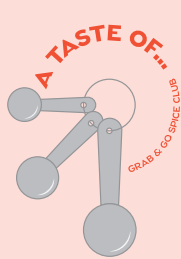

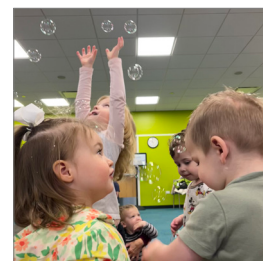
